Mowers:

Pre-operation checks

- 1) Please check condition of the mowers before starting operations.
- 2) Check oil level to be within the hatch lines on the dip sticks.
 1. Quarts of oil are kept in the storage container.
 2. Please let the field manager know if you have used the last of the engine oil.
- 3) Check the oil filter on the green mower; it tends to loosen.
- 4) Check tires for proper inflation.
 1. There is a 12 volt tire inflator kept in the storage container.
- 5) It is best to fill gas tanks before start of operations when the engine is cold.
- 6) We ask the mower team to replenish gas used for the next team.
 1. The club will reimburse gas purchase. Forward receipts to the Treasurer.
 2. Please let the field manager know if the gasoline supply is low.
- 7) Two one-gallon gas cans of two-cycle gas are kept in the storage container for use with the trimmer and blower.
 1. Two-cycle oil is kept in the storage container. Mix gas to 50:1 ratio.
 2. Please let field manager know if two-cycle oil supply is low.
- 8) The trimmer head is now a quick change manual head; it is not self feeding. Worn trimmer lines are removed by pulling them through the center of the head. Two new ~8" lines of trimmer cord are inserted from the outside of the head toward the center. Tug on the string to check it is secure.
 1. Please inform the field manager when the trimmer string supply is getting low.
- 9) The push mower is handy for trimming the fence line to reduce damage caused by trimming with the larger mowers. A single width in and outside the fence is adequate.

Post-Operation checks

- 10) Please use the blower to clear the upper surfaces of the mowers.
- 11) Please follow the cleaning instructions for the Zero-turn mower posted in the johnny.
- 12) Return all equipment to the storage container and secure the shed.

Thank you for volunteering your time and labor to keep the field trimmed and serviceable. We all appreciate your efforts.
