






There was even a small electic powered flying boat that made an impressive flight.

June 7, 2006

MEETING OPENED: 7:00 PM

## OLD BUSINESS:

- Troy Von Kloha reported that the Whirley Birds event of June 3-4 had 6 pilot participants from five states.
- Bob Arata reported that the Control Line Speed and Racing Event of May 20-21 had 22 participants from 12 states and consisted of 64 events.
- Bruce Weidner reported that the May 6 Scout Rocket Derby was a success with 160 flights by the Scouts and 40 by the Rocketry Assn. Thanks to the R/C and Control Line pilots who flew demonstration fights for the Scouts during the mid-day break.

### NEW BUSINESS:

- Mr. Peter Dunn, Mr. Tom Ott, and Ms. Mary Kraner from St. Louis County Parks Dept. attended the meeting to discuss the Usage Agreement draft that was handed out at the May GSLMA meeting. The following are highlights from that discussion:
  - 1. It is the responsibility of GSLMA Safety Officers to monitor flight operations at Buder to ensure that flying rules are being observed. It is the Parks Dept. responsibility to deal with other park users who do not comply with safety rules in the flying areas. Parks Dept. Rangers will also respond to calls from Safety Officers when a flyer refuses to abide by flying regulations.
  - 2. GSLMA is responsible for coordinating and requesting park reservations for all flying events at Buder.
  - 3. New signage which says "AMA/Liability Insurance is required" in order to fly at Buder is being considered by the Parks Dept.
  - 4. A joint GSLMA/Parks Dept. review of the flying rules will take place later this year.
  - 5. Some modifications to the usage agreement draft may be made by the Parks Dept. as a result of our discussion.
- Sign-Up sheets for participation in Extravaganza were handed out at the meeting. Clubs are asked to solicit members to participate as flyers or workers or both. Those who assist with parking for at least one hour will be treated to a drink, burger and chips.
