## May 19, 2018 MVSA Sailplane Contest (Contest Director- Wayne Wimbish) Hi fliers,

It turned out to be an absolutely wonderful day for flying even though Friday's rain cast serious doubts and the early morning fog caused a brief delay.

Things kicked off about 9:30am with five eager hand launch fliers ready to test the air. Two new fliers to the group, Duane Youngman and Kevin Cox meant that not only could we finally have a contest, but now we could actually fly HL tasks in flight groups. We started out with three rounds of All Up Last Down, followed by Last Flight, 5x2, and Last Flight. I was very impressed with Duane as he is new to HL and showed a really great spirit with constant improvement in his launches and flying. When he gets locked in he will be a serious contender. Kevin was a welcome sight too with his Taboo GT. He showed that he had serious chops right off the bat. In the end Old Age and treachery held the day against youth and vitality. After six great rounds we had to step off the field so that we could get set up for 2M. Here is how thing s shook out in the end.

Two meter was a horse of a different color. We had a steady breeze out of the west more often than not all morning, and that was the forecast, and also where the wind was when we set the high starts. Would you know that the wind switched 180deg around to the east as we began the first round. High starts and down wind launches are not a great combination and we suffered tremendously. My launches we averaging about 100-125 feet as were most others. The only ones with decent launches were the electrics which were set to 100meters. Surprisingly, most of the time the radians were back on the ground just as quickly as the high starts. Some high overcast came in and shut down the lift after a few rounds so it became somewhat of a repetitive grind to launch, land, and go get the high start for the next round. I was so sore by the end of the day I could not get out of the car when I got home. Shortly after most had left a thunderstorm hit. Bill Coalson's new canopy got bent up in the wind. I hope it is repairable. Bill and I were finishing up loading the last items in a driving rain and I think he went off and left his stakes on the field. (Thank you to John Heienickle for venturing back up there to retrieve them.)

After six rounds of some brutal flying here is how 2 meter ended up. Note that the electrics came in 1,2,3, and 6th. We'll get them next time for sure.
