Phantom Flyers Club Meeting Minutes September 16, 2019

Vice President William Ahrens opened the meeting at 7:00 pm at the Flying Field. The President Jan Jansen was unavailable for the meeting. There were 8 members in attendance.

Tech Session

Jim West showed off a new tool recently purchased for building. It was a WEN ½ inch belt sander. The belt width is only ½ inch wide. The sander also has an adjustable speed. This tool was purchased specifically to enlarge the servo holes in a new model. The servos are mounted into the wing about 2 inches and would have been a difficult and lengthy process to file them out. The WEN made the job very easy and saved a lot of time. The cost was around \$35.

Secretary's Report

The Club is currently at 37 regular members. The August Meeting minutes were approved.

Treasurers Report

Jose again reported that Club finances are improved due to donations from club members. Big thanks to all that have contributed. We are still looking for donations.

Safety Report

The Safety Manager was unavailable at the meeting. Though there were no injuries Don Grzina reported that his new three bladed prop ejected a blade. The blade sheared clean off of his propeller at the hub when Don was testing his speed controller. The unbalance situation tore up the nose of the plane as well. The lesson learned is that when we are standing alongside of a rotating propeller we are in the line of fire if a blade is lost.

Field Managers Report

- Unfortunately, the Red Zero Turn is leaking oil again and is not usable. We will need to get it back to the shop for repairs. This was discussed in some detail including how much we should approve to repair the mower. It was decided to fund another \$500 for the repair if need be. The members also considered an additional \$300 for the repair if needed but that must be approved from a majority vote of Board Members and Club Officers. If this amount is needed it will significantly impact the Club's budget. A replacement mower was briefly discussed.
- ✤ A motion was passed to allow up to \$500 for another repair of the Zero Turn Mower.
- A motion was passed to allow up to an additional \$300 for the repair if needed with the approval of a majority vote from the Club Officers and Board Members.
- We will once again need volunteers to transport the mower to and from the repair shop.
- Don also asked for volunteers to do extra duty to mow the lawn mid-week before the Pattern Contest. Jim West and Ed White volunteered.

Activities Report

- The annual Fun Fly at Wright City was attended by some of our Club. One plane was lost and a good time was had by all.
- The Club hosted a Sailplane Contest. Jan Jansen was the CD. I kept hearing at the meeting that Bill Ahrens beat Kevin Cox.
- Next Glider contest is Oct 5 or 6.
- The Pattern Contest is Sept 28/29

GLSMA News

Harold made it to the Meeting. Bob Gill discussed the problem with a swamp area at part of the field. Apparently, a drain had clogged up and was preventing proper drainage of the field. Bob was instrumental at getting it cleared. The St Louis County Parks were called in and helped with the removal of the debris.
